Plainfield, NJ – July 28, 2020- To date, the George Floyd Police Reform Commission (GFPRC) has held several private sessions focused on reviewing the current policies and procedures of the Plainfield Police Department. Racial tension has haunted our nation for centuries and it has been exacerbated by recent public killings of black men and women, which has sparked nationwide protests. The GFPRC has been tasked with looking for solutions, where needed, and making reasoned recommendations which will be submitted as a public report.

To ensure that the report is given proper time and attention, the Commission will present its recommendations on August 14, 2020. During the process of compiling its report, the Commission will host two public hearings via the Zoom virtual platform. Questions, input and insight from residents will be invited and recorded at these public sessions. The public hearings will take place on the following dates:

July 28, 2020 – 7:00 PM August 4, 2020 – 7:00 PM

The City of Plainfield is dedicated to finding solutions based on fairness, equality, and peace. We hope that the George Floyd Police Reform Commission, will be instrumental in opening discussions and sparking change where needed.
