#### REGULATIONS AND SPECIFICATIONS

April THROUGH September 2016

**NEW STORM WATER REGULATIONS ARE IN EFFECT.** State Mandate: All municipalities must remove loose debris from curb areas within seven (7) days or residents will be required to bag leaves and yard waste placed at the curb. Failure to comply will subject the City to fines. In an effort to prevent our residents from mandatory bagging of leaves and yard waste, it is crucial that all yard waste and leaves be placed at curb no later than 6 A.M. the day of pickup.

#### Brush and Tree parts:

All brush and tree parts **MUST** be tied and bundled.

- Maximum length – 4 feet
- Maximum weight – 50 pounds

Maximum bundles per pickup – 8

Oversized or untied brush and tree parts are an improper putout and will be subject to citation by a City Code Enforcement Officer. Residents or private contractors can take brush and tree parts, in excess of the above limits, to the PMUA, Rock Avenue Transfer Station. Fees will apply. **PROPERTY OWNERS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE REMOVAL OF THEIR PRIVATE TREES OR TREE PARTS WHEN THEY EXCEED THE ABOVE LIMITATIONS.**

#### SPRING CLEANUP – Leaves and Yard Waste:

Place leaves and yard waste at curb loose or in biodegradable paper bags **ONLY**. Bags are available at the City Yard, 745 South Avenue. **DO NOT** contaminate with litter, dirt, grass, garbage or any other foreign objects. Plastic bags are an illegal putout and will be subject to a citation by a City Code Enforcement Officer.

**Grass will not be picked up at anytime during the program. DO NOT** place loose leaves or bagged leaves at the curb until the scheduled pickup date (see map and schedule inside). Maximum bag weight: 50 pounds.

- **DO NOT MIX BAGS WITH BUNDLED BRUSH!!!**  
**Mixed leaves and brush will not be picked up.**



## From the Mayor's Desk

Dear Homeowner:

2016 has been a very busy year for the Department of Public Works. The unusual weather pattern brought many operational challenges. For example: Seasonal low temperatures caused potholes to appear earlier than usual and a blizzard dumped over 28 inches of snow. This was the most powerful storm to strike this area in a very long time. The storm brought hardships to our residents and business owners. Our DPW staff and First Responders worked around the clock battling extreme weather conditions to keep our roadways open for emergency response. Private contractors were used to provide additional equipment and staff to assist with our snow removal operations. I thank our Public Works staff and First Responders for their commitment to public safety.

It is my pleasure to provide you with the Division of Public Works 2016 Spring Schedule for the brush and yard waste curbside pick-up. Attached are the scheduled pick-up dates for your area. Keep this brochure in a convenient place and refer to it over the coming months.

Listed below are highlights from the Division of Public Works:

♦ **POTHOLE DOCTOR:** The recently purchased automated pothole filler was delivered in January 2016. It performs pavement preservation using a spray injection technology. A single operator can control a hydraulic broom from the safety of the Pothole Doctor's cab. It clears the pothole of debris, applies liquid emulsion that fills it, seals it and then it tops it off with a dry aggregate coating. This task would normally take three (3) employees to complete. The repaired roadway is immediately ready to handle traffic. The repairs are significantly better and last longer than the cold patch method. This is one example of how our Division of Public Works is using technology to reduce cost.

♦ **Spring/Summer curbside collections:** See schedule for pick-up dates.

♦ **Road Maintenance: Shared services will continue with the Union County Road Division.** This program is a great example of how there are cost savings when agencies work together sharing equipment, work experience and staff. Several streets are scheduled for spot milling and top coat replacement.


♦ **The Mayor's "LIGHT UP THE CITY" Campaign:** This program started in August of 2014. Residents were asked to report light outages and dimly lit areas along city streets. Residents reported over 250 light outages and requested 75 new light fixtures. Please call our Public Works Division at (908) 753-3427 to report a light outage or to request a new light fixture.

In closing, I would like to remind everyone how important it is to follow the rules and regulations outlined in the brochure.
