REGULATIONS AND SPECIFICATIONS

APRIL THROUGH DECEMBER 2023

STORM WATER REGULATIONS ARE IN EFFECT. State Mandate: All municipalities must remove loose debris from curb areas within seven (7) days or residents will be required to bag leaves and yard waste placed at the curb. Failure to comply will subject the City to fines. In an effort to prevent our residents from mandatory bagging of leaves and yard waste, it is crucial that all yard waste and leaves be placed at curb no later than 6 A.M. the day of pickup.

Brush and Tree parts:

All brush and tree parts MUST be tied and bundled.

- Maximum length 4 feet
- Maximum weight 50 pounds

Maximum bundles per pickup - 8

Oversized or untied brush and tree parts are an improper putout and will be subject to citation by a City Code Enforcement Officer. Residents or private contractors can take brush and tree parts, in excess of the above limits to the Transfer Station located at 95 Rock Ave. Fees will apply. PROPERTY OWNERS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE REMOVAL OF THEIR PRIVATE TREES OR TREE PARTS WHEN THEY EXCEED THE ABOVE LIMITATIONS.

Leaves and Yard Waste:

Place leaves and yard waste at curb loose or in biodegradable paper bag ONLY. Do not contaminate with litter, dirt, garbage or any other foreign objects. Plastic bags are an illegal putout and will be subject to a citation by a City Code Enforcement Officer.

<u>Grass will be excepted in biodegradable bags only</u>. <u>DO NOT</u> place loose leaves or bagged leaves at the curb until the scheduled pickup date (see map and schedule inside). Maximum bag weight: 50 pounds.

• <u>DO NOT MIX BAGS WITH BUNDLED BRUSH</u>!!! Mixed leaves and brush will not be picked up.

The City of Plainfield continues to demonstrate that we can overcome any challenge by working together as a community. Covid –19 still hovers as we move into 2023, and even as we settle back into our regular routines, we must remain vigilant. Following the guidelines set by the CDC will ensure that we remain a healthy city. My administration and team of dedicated city employees are working hard and continue to provide essential services for residents with minimal disruption. Attached are the scheduled dates for the pick-ups in your area. Keep this brochure in a convenient place and refer to it over the coming months. Please follow the rules outlined, and this will assist our DPW team with their collections and ensure the highest level of efficiency.

As the weather changes and we prepare to resume outdoor activities, please be reminded of the impact this has on our stormwater. Gardening, lawn care, and debris accumulation all directly affect our stormwater. Explore the possibility of natural fertilizers, composting, and other alternatives. Over the past year, our DPW Division continues to provide outstanding service:

Curbside Collection:

- Each property owner received a minimum of ten curbside collections.
- Our team collected over 17,487 yards of debris.

Milling, Paving, and Reconstruction:

The road maintenance program continued to be a top priority. To date, our team has:

◆ Repaved 137-Roadways Approximately 46 miles or close to 50% of Plainfield streets

- Made crosswalks ADA compliant
- Striped roads

In-house Crack Sealant:

The road repair crew applied over 37,000 linear feet (8.03 miles) of hot emulsion sealant to fractures along recently milled and paved roads. This treatment helps prevent liquid from penetrating the road cracks that lead to road failure (potholes).

Litter Removal and Street Sweeping: The self-contained and fully hydraulic road sweeper allowed crews to remove litter and debris safely. Street Sweeping crews continued a seven-day street sweeping schedule for the UEZ zone. Street sweeping crews logged a total of 9,265 miles and removed over 1027 tons of debris from the city streets.

Snow and De-Icing Operations:


Our area has experienced a mild weather pattern through the first part of the year with most of the snow accumulations in the high elevation areas. However, our DPW snow fighters were ready to respond to any inclement with events ensuring streets are clear for emergency response vehicles and other essential travel.


