Two Thousand, One Hundred and Eighty- One (2181) Confirmed Cases of COVID-19 in Plainfield. Additional Three Thousand, One Hundred and Eighty-Nine (3189) In Quarantine.

June 9, 2020

Dear Friends and Neighbors,

As of Tuesday, June 9, 2020, the number of positive COVID-19 cases in Plainfield now stands at **Two Thousand, One Hundred and Eighty-One (2181)** within the ages of twenty-four (24) days old to ninety-six (96) years old. There are an additional **Three Thousand, One Hundred and Eighty-Nine (3189)** individuals quarantined as a result of exposure to the virus. There are no new deaths to report today.

Yesterday, June 8, 2020, New Jersey's Department of Health issued COVID-19 health and safety guidelines for summer youth camps which can begin operating on July 6. Summer youth camps are required to submit the Youth Camp Attestation Form to the Department of Health at least one full day before the camp's opening date. Gov. Phil Murphy announced in a Press Conference on Tuesday June 8, that the statewide stay-at-home order that took effect March 21 in response to the COVID-19 pandemic has been lifted, and limits on indoor and outdoor gatherings have been raised, "We are no longer requiring you to stay at home, but we are asking you to continue to be responsible and safe," Murphy said. **"When you do go out please continue to wear face coverings and keep social distance from others whenever possible."** Indoor dining is still not allowed. If the data changes and COVID-19 cases rise, Murphy said officials will consider implementing more restrictions again. "Social distancing will remain our watch words," Murphy said. "While they will allow for greater movement and greater flexibility, our number one concern must remain public health."

Here in Plainfield we will continue to exercise the utmost caution according to our situation. Parts of our city are densely populated and we must continue to follow restrictions until we are sure that the numbers won't spike again.

This **Thursday, June 11 at 6:00pm** I will be joined once again by several Faith Leaders for our third fellowship by live broadcast. We hope that these broadcasts provide comfort, bolster faith, and give hope to our community during these challenging times.

Moving forward, we will no longer be sending daily updates. We will send these updates **twice a week on Mondays and Thursdays**. If the numbers begin to rise again, we will increase the frequency as necessary in order for you to be informed and safe.
