REGULATIONS AND SPECIFICATIONS

April THROUGH September 2017

NEW STORM WATER REGULATIONS ARE IN EFFECT. State Mandate:

All municipalities must remove loose debris from curb areas within seven (7) days or residents will be required to bag leaves and yard waste placed at the curb. Failure to comply will subject the City to fines. In an effort to prevent our residents from mandatory bagging of leaves and yard waste, it is crucial that all yard waste and leaves be placed at curb no later than 6 A.M. the day of pickup.

Brush and Tree parts:

All brush and tree parts **MUST** be tied and bundled.

- Maximum length – 4 feet
- Maximum weight – 50 pounds

Maximum bundles per pickup – 8

Oversized or untied brush and tree parts are an improper putout and will be subject to citation by a City Code Enforcement Officer. Residents or private contractors can take brush and tree parts, in excess of the above limits, to the PMUA, Rock Avenue Transfer Station. Fees will apply. For more information, call the Transfer Station at (908) 226-2518.

PROPERTY OWNERS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE REMOVAL OF THEIR PRIVATE TREES OR TREE PARTS WHEN THEY EXCEED THE ABOVE LIMITATIONS.



From the Mayor's Desk

It's my pleasure to provide you with the Division of Public Works 2017 Spring Schedule for the brush and yard waste curbside pick-up. Attached are the scheduled pick-up dates for your area. Keep this brochure in a convenient place and refer to it over the coming months.

Our Department of Public Works had a very busy year in 2016, and 2017 promises to be even busier. From snow removal, pickup of brush and yard waste, support for many City sponsored events, to road repairs and maintenance. The DPW team has gained a reputation for responsiveness and excellent service which helps the City on its journey of renewal and renaissance.

After dealing with the unexpected and sad loss of our Director mid-year, the DPW team rallied and continued to provide the outstanding service to which we had grown accustomed. We were happy to welcome Oren K. Dabney Sr. as the new Director in December. Director Dabney hit the ground running and is providing solid leadership forged in years of experience.

This year the team is poised to build on the momentum of 2016, and road work totaling over five (5) million dollars is scheduled to be completed. A portion of the amount will be directed to continue the very successful Milling and Paving Program that started last year. Taking advantage of the cooperative purchasing power of more than 200 municipalities, the areas to be milled and paved will total over 3.25 miles. Utilizing the pothole doctor, they will continue to make longer-lasting repairs to our roads at a lower cost. The spray injection technology is more efficient than the standard application, and a single operator can make repairs from the safety of the truck's cab. Labor cost is reduced drastically compared to the standard 2-3 street maintenance crews that most municipalities use.

Shared Services with Union County Road Division will continue: This program continues to be an excellent example of cost savings when agencies work together sharing equipment, work experience, and staff. Several streets are scheduled for spot milling and top coat replacement.

Crack Sealant Program: Seasonal employees along with the various youth programs scheduled for this summer will assist our DPW staff in road maintenance. Crack sealant prevents liquid from penetrating the road surface and extends the life of the road.



As spring approaches and we begin to think of cleaning our properties, it's a good time to remind all residents of the importance of Storm Water Management and the impact it has on the environment. Storm Water is generated by rain or snow that runs off a land surface such as saturated soils or impervious (nonporous) surfaces like rooftops and parking lots.

Many contaminants can be found in storm water including sediment, metals, oils, nutrients, bacteria and viruses. These contaminants are easily dislodged and may be carried by Storm Water into sewers, streams, and eventually reservoirs. Studies have shown that under certain circumstances, runoff generated during the first hour of moderate-to-high intensity storm events may contain greater pollutant concentration than raw sewage. It is this "first flush" of pollutants that many Storm Water Management programs are designed to address.


The DPW team understands the importance of Storm Water Management and ensures that Plainfield does its part by adhering to guidelines and regulations.
